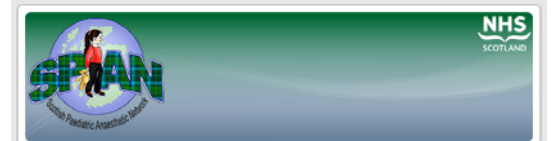

By rail:

Glasgow's St Enoch Station on the city's subway network is approximately **20 yards from the entrance to Teacher Building** and can be seen upon exit from the station (come out and turn right into St Enoch Place). Walking:

From **Glasgow Queen Street**: Come out of the station onto George Street with George Square ahead of you. Turn right and take Queen Street down and turn right onto Argyle Street. Take the first left onto Buchanan Street to meet St. Enoch Square and Teacher Building.

From **Glasgow Central Station**: Come out of the station onto Union Street. Walk straight down and turn left onto Argyle Street. Take the first road on the right into St Enoch square, where IET Glasgow: Teacher Building is on the right.

By road:

From the North: Via the A82 and M8, exit junction 19

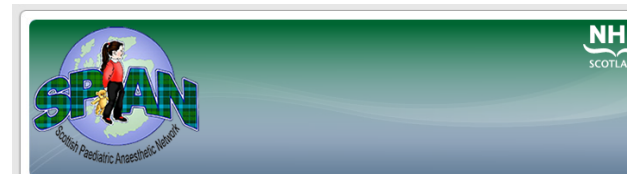
From the East: Via the M8, exit junction 19

From the South: Via the M74 and M8, exit junction 19

From the West: Via the M8, exit junction 19

From M8, Junction 19:

Leaving Junction 19, you come onto Argyle Street (A814). Follow this road until you reach Jamaica Street on your right. Turn into Jamaica Street and follow down until Howard Street on your left. There is a Thistle Car Park is on the corner where these 2 streets meet.
